Synopsis: Narrator and 9-16 actors depict Jesus' parable of the Wheat and Weeds in Matthew 13. Good and evil are not always easy to distinguish and must co-exist until the time of final judgment.

Topics: Evil, Judgment, Patience, Growth, Wisdom.

Time Requirements: 3 minutes

Characters:

Narrator- the glue of the script, directly addresses the audience.

Farmer- wise and patient.

Servants 1 & 2- hardworking, determined, impulsive.

Enemy- stealthy and sinister.


Seeds & Weeds- visual props, dressed completely in black, representing good and evil.

User's Guide



Discussion Point:

Do you mow the lawn? Weed the garden? Do you ever wonder who decided which plants were good and which were weeds? Have you ever noticed that most weeds eventually get flowers? Author's Note: Scene opens on narrator and farmer. As the farmer sows, the seeds run out, report to the farmer, and then curl up into tight "balls" on the stage.






FERTILIZING WEEDS?

Props: Black dress for seeds and Enemy.

Stage Setup:



Script

Narrator: The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field.

Farmer: Ok, so this is good. All this good seed, here. I think I'll toss this seed right over here. And this seed... over here. You, over there,... you, you, you... all of you, out. Out to the soil. What good is seed if it's never planted? So everybody, get outa' here.

Narrator: But while everyone was sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and went away.

Discussion Point: What do you think Jesus meant when he called some people "weeds" and some people "wheat"? Was he being judgmental?	Blocking: Seeds and weeds both gradually rise together until they're at full height with arms stretched out over their heads. When they're fully up, they freeze in place.	Narrator: When the wheat sprouted and formed heads, then the weeds also appeared.

this weed, you'll kill the wheat. See how their roots are all intertwined? There's no way to get rid of the weeds without pulling up the wheat.

Servant 1: So whatta' we do?

Farmer: Whatta' we do? We keep our heads. You see... whoever did this is counting on us to panic. He thinks we'll be so panicked about the weeds, that we'll destroy our own crop trying to exterminate them.

Servant 2: So we live with it?

Farmer: We live with it. We get used to having weeds around. We even water the weeds. We might even have to fertilize the weeds. But we don't panic.

Servant 1: So we let both grow together?

Farmer: Until the harvest. Then we'll collect the weeds and tie them in bundles to be burned; and then gather the wheat and bring it into the barn.

Narrator: It took some getting used to. At first the servants could hardly stand walking by the weeds and doing nothing. But... the strategy worked. Eventually the weeds were burned and the wheat was saved.

Farmer: So look around today. See any weeds?

Servant 1: They're everywhere, growing right among us.

Narrator: They're at school, work, even church.

Farmer: Sometimes it's really hard to tell the wheat from the weeds, since they look a lot alike.

Servant 2: But do we panic? Do we drag out giant buckets of weed killer?

Blocking: The farmer continues to use the weeds and wheat as "props" as he explains how to treat them.

Blocking: All the wheat and the weeds fall over together and are carried off/herded off by the servants.

Blocking: At this point all the characters drop their original characterization and become "themselves," directly addressing the audience. They should end the script side by side, facing the audience.

Discussion Point:

If you look at your life today at school and church, where do you see wheat and weeds growing side by side? How do you know which is which?



SCRIPTURE LINK:

MATTHEW 7:16-18 BY THEIR FRUIT YOU WILL RECOGNIZE THEM. DO PEOPLE PICK GRAPES FROM THORNBUSHES, OR FIGS FROM THISTLES? LIKEWISE EVERY GOOD TREE BEARS GOOD FRUIT, BUT A BAD TREE BEARS BAD FRUIT. A GOOD TREE CANNOT BEAR BAD FRUIT, AND A BAD TREE CANNOT BEAR GOOD FRUIT. Narrator: Or do we keep our heads? Live each day with weeds around us. Knowing that one day the harvest will come, and the Farmer will sort everything out.
