WMI Vocal Audition - Bass

This sheet is to be used alongside the recorded audio when you video your vocal audition. Instructions of how to record the video can be found on www.usamusicwest.org/wmi2024. The audio is a continous, roughly 7 minute recording that walks you through the process. Feel free to practice as much as you like but when you send in the video, please make sure it is a single, unedited video.


In the past we have done these auditions on the first day but it it a lengthy process, so the hope is that by submitting vocal auditions ahead of time, it will make the first day much easier, and hopefully be less stressful for you all! However, chocolate bribes are still encouraged! Everyone is in a choir, no matter what your major is, so these auditions determine which choir will help you learn and thrive the most.

Section 1 - Scales

This section will let us know your singing range. Each time, you will hear the piano play a chord for 2 beats, then your starting note for another 2 beats. For the first two scales, you will sing up and down in quarter notes (1 beat) using the word 'La'. Don't repeat the top note!



The next 2 scales will see how high and low you can go. Don't hurt yourself, but keep going until you reach your limit. Like before, the piano will play a chord for 2 beats, you'll hear your starting note four 2 beats, but this time you will sing half notes (2 beats).



Section 2 - Note Matching

This next section will test how accurate you are with tuning. You'll hear notes played on the piano and you simply have to sing them back. There is no written music for this section, so to practice, just sit at the piano, play random notes and sing them back.

- (a) You will hear a single note and you just sing it back to the word 'la'. This will be done three times.
- (b) You will hear a 2-note chord and be asked to sing back either the upper or lower note, using the word 'la'. This will be done twice.

Section 3 - Sing a Melody

The purpose of the next section is for us to hear your voice in the context of singing a melody, and your musicianship. Feel free to make this your own. The music provided below is just a guide, but we want to hear your unique personality and style.
